The need for improvements of streets and sidewalks in the City of Russell is evident throughout the entire community due to sidewalks and streets falling into major disrepair.

The walk-ability of Russell specifically Downtown Russell is currently very poor. We currently are dealing with extremely long crosswalks in Downtown Russell, which put pedestrians at risk while crossing the street. Downtown is used as a corridor for many events; it also is utilized by many children walking to and from school, the public library, parks, etc. The RAISE grant would allow for our community to reduce the potential risk for pedestrians by revamping the crosswalks to provide a shorter distance for pedestrians to cross and increase visibility for vehicle operators. Additionally, the RAISE Grant would allow the City of Russell to create multiple modes of safe transportation for our community members to access businesses, governmental services, medical services, etc.
